- Provides historical tracking of an image's online presence.

#### Cons:

Smaller database compared to Google Images.

### 3. Metadata & Watermark Tracking

Best for: Proving ownership and tracking use over time.

#### How to Add Metadata:

- Use tools like **Adobe Photoshop**, **Lightroom**, **or XnView** to embed copyright details into image metadata.
- Include your name, website, and copyright notice in the metadata.

#### How to Track Metadata:

- Use tools like ExifTool or Metadata2Go to check if your metadata remains intact online.
- Some websites remove metadata, so use watermarks as additional protection.

# **Using Watermarks:**

- Place a small, semi-transparent watermark on your images.
- Keep an original, unwatermarked version for legal proof.

# 4. Copyright Monitoring Tools

Best for: Continuous monitoring and automatic detection.

#### **Useful Tools:**

- Pixsy Automated reverse image search for tracking image use.
- Copytrack Helps track image theft and recover licensing fees.
- Berify Uses facial recognition and image search to detect misuse.

## 5. Monitoring Social Media & Marketplaces

Best for: Finding unauthorized sales of your work.

#### How to Monitor:

- Search for your artwork title or signature on Instagram, Etsy, Redbubble, and Amazon.

- Set up Google Alerts for your name, brand, or artwork title.
